About Red Nose Day

Red Nose Day is one of the longest-running and most recognisable fundraising and awareness days in Australia.

For the past 35 years, Australians have rallied to fund ground-breaking research, lifesaving education, and bereavement services to support Australian families.

Since Red Nose Day began in 1988, there's been an incredible 80% reduction in sudden infant deaths. But even with this reduction, our work is not close to being done.

That's because every day, 9 babies and young children still die suddenly and unexpectedly in Australia – that's a heartbreaking 3,000 little lives lost every year.

For these devastated families, Red Nose relies on Australians' generosity to provide much-needed counselling and support to the thousands of families experiencing the unimaginable grief of losing their baby or child.

Aim of the Red Nose Day 2023 Campaign

Our goal is to raise \$1,000,000 this Red Nose Day to help fund critical research, support services for families, and to save little lives through our education and advocacy programs.

The awareness campaign runs from the month of July until the middle of August, with the majority of campaign activity taking place on the week of Red Nose Day (Monday 7 - Friday 11 August).

How can people get involved in Red Nose Day?

Where does the money go?

Every dollar raised on Red Nose Day funds research, support services for heartbroken families, and our education and advocacy program to save little lives.

Some examples include:

- \$45 can help save a baby's life by funding a parent's call to our Safe Sleep Advice Line.
- \$80 can provide immediate support for a grief- stricken family in crisis.
- \$128 can fund a hospital discharge pack with all of the tools a new parent needs to keep baby safe at home.
- \$250 can help fund ground-breaking research to help unlock the reasons why babies die from SIDS and stillbirth, and then help prevent it.

Our impact so far

- Over \$18m invested in research to date
- 80% reduction in Sudden Infant Death in Australia
- Over 11,000 little lives saved and counting since the first Red Nose Day

The digital filters are a quick, easy and effective way for organisations and employees to show their support and encourage people within their network to get involved in Red Nose Day.


How it works:

Advice for posts with babies in photos/videos

Red Nose has an important role to play in educating Australians about keeping babies safe. The following tips are in line with the kind of advice Red Nose provides new parents every day. We'd appreciate your support in following the below advice for any posts you create with babies featured.

Baby asleep or in cot

If you are including photos of babies sleeping or in their cot, please ensure they are doing so safely-in line with our Red Nose Safe Sleep Image Guidelines. Ensure cots are empty with no pillows, blankets or plush toys. No loose sheets, settling devices, incline devices.

Baby at play

If you are including photos of babies playing, please ensure they are not wearing any necklaces or dummy clips. Please don't include photos of young babies on their tummy, unless you can see a parent or guardian supervising in the photo.

Babies and Red Noses

The Digital Red Nose filter is the only way to go for such a little nose! Physical Red Noses should only be worn by children aged over three.



Facts about Stillbirth & Sudden Infant Death

What is stillbirth and sudden infant death?

Stillbirth is where a baby dies from 20 weeks and onwards in pregnancy.

SUDI stands for Sudden Unexpected Death in Infancy. It is the umbrella term for all deaths that occur in babies aged 0-12 months where the baby dies while sleeping or in the sleeping environment. It includes SIDS, overheating, suffocation, falling out of the cot, co-sleeping and smothering.

SIDS is a specific medical designation given when a baby dies in the sleeping environment, but after thorough investigation the actual cause of death cannot be determined.

How many Australian babies sadly die each year?

The latest statistics are heartbreaking. More than 3,000 Australian babies die suddenly and unexpectedly each year - that's more than 9 little lives lost every single day.

What is known about stillbirth causes?

In Australia, over 50% of stillbirths that occur each year - in the last weeks of an otherwise healthy pregnancy - have no known cause or causes, but there are things parents can do to reduce their risk.

How can stillbirth risks be reduced?

During pregnancy, mums-to-be should:

- Not smoke or be around people smoking
- Sleep on their side in the last trimester
- Be conscious of their baby's movements, and seek medical assistance if something changes
- Lead a healthy lifestyle

How can sudden infant death risks be reduced?

There are six key ways to sleep baby safely and reduce the risk of sudden infant death:

- 1. Sleep baby on their back
- 2. Keep head and face uncovered
- 3. Keep baby smoke free before and after birth
- 4. Safe sleeping environment night and day
- 5. Sleep baby in safe cot in parents' room
- **6.** Breastfeed baby
